We are excited to announce our Annual Spring Dinner and Scholarship Fundraiser on Thursday, April 30th at the Wethersfield Country Club. Our Keynote Speaker for the event will be **Brian Evanko**, Penn State class of 1998 and president of Cigna's US Government segment. Brian will be discussing the role of public vs. private health care in the US including the concept of Medicare for All.

Brian has worked at Cigna for over 20 years, beginning his career as an actuary and progressing through various leadership roles which included his living in Singapore and Hong Kong for several years. He is on the Board of Trustees of the Connecticut Science Center, serves as a race guide for runners with disabilities through Achilles International, and has testified before Congress about health care reform.

Doors open at 6pm with dinner starting at 6:30. The cost of the event is \$40 per person, nonmembers \$45 per person. 
